Class Differentiation

- Class is grouped (lit/num) according to pupil ability, but groups are fluid and change frequently
- Children are continually urged to assess themselves and their peers. Any criticism is positive and constructive

Child Protection

- Article 19 states all children have the right to protection from violence, abuse and neglect.
- Schools must have designated teachers for child protection
- Designated teacher: Mr McGinley
- Deputy Designated teacher: Mrs Treacy

Numeracy in Primary 6

- Number: within 1,000,000, use of 4 functions, relationship between fraction, decimal, percentage, money and savings, long multiplication. Quick recall of all times tables, square numbers, prime numbers, triangular numbers, multiples and factors.
- Shape and space: properties of 2/3D shapes. Perimeter, area and volume, composite language
- Measures: weight, length, capacity, angles (measuring, drawing, identifying). Time, analogue and digital in one minute intervals, 12/24hr and timetables and calendars
- Data handling: drawing and interpreting all types of graphs, spreadsheets, database and probability.

Healthy Eating

- As a compromise, one sweet treat can form part of lunch
- Children are not permitted fizzy, isotonic or energy drinks (unless for medical reasons)
