

What is Bullying?

As a Rights Respecting School, we carried out a survey of the pupils (Article 12) and from that we think we need to let everybody know what bullying is!

The school policy says it is, "The targeted use of aggression with the intention of hurting another person. Bullying results in pain and distress to the victim."

The Article 12 Society thinks it is,
"hurting someone repeatedly by hitting
them, calling them names, picking on
them, always leaving them out on purpose
or sending nasty messages online to cause
someone to be scared, sad, worried,
afraid or upset."

Bullying happens when someone is horrible to you a lot and you feel like it happens all the time. It can make you feel scared or sad.

If something happens once, that may not be bullying but you should still tell someone.

What can you do?

You must tell someone if you or someone you know is being bullied.

Who can you tell?

You can tell any adult you feel comfortable talking to e.g.

- Mum or Dad
- Guardian
- · Aunt or Uncle
- Granny or Grandad
- Teacher
- Mrs Treacy
- Mr McGinley
- Lunchtime supervisor
- Family Friend

Or you can tell a friend or member of the Article 12 Society and ask them to help you tell.
